Workshop Descriptions

<u>Iris Folding Cards</u> – Iris Folding is a technique that can be used to make greeting cards, scrapbook pages or pieces to be framed. The method begins with cutting a shape out of cardstock and then filling in the opening with a series of coloured strips of paper. The design created by the placement of the paper will resemble the iris of a camera or an eye, thus the name Iris Folding. A card will be made in the session.

<u>Fabric Necklaces</u> – These, are cute, easy, fast and cheap to make. They can be made from scrap fabric to match your wardrobe. They make great gifts for all ages. To be completed in the session.

<u>Fabric Painting</u> – This technique shows you how to Marble Print fabric. It is fun to do and you never know what the resulting fabric will look like.

<u>Fabric Thread Catcher Bag</u>- This is a neat little bag to put by your sewing machine to use as a catcher for your threads. It is completely sewn by hand and folds compactly with a twist for carrying to workshops. Kit provided and your bag should be completed in the session.

<u>Hexamania</u> – This is a three dimensional fabric hexagon that when finished will measure 3 ½ x 3 ½ x 3 ½. Kit provided and project should be finished in the session. Makes a nice Christmas decoration.

<u>Manxx Block</u> – This is an ancient quilt block that in olden times was completely made by hand. You will learn the story of the Manxx block and go away with a finished block to use in a project of your choice.

<u>English Paper Piecing -</u> Create quilt blocks by wrapping fabric around paper patterns. A useful technique for hand piecing as precision piecing can be achieved.

<u>Genealogy</u> – This workshop will cover the origins of pioneer settlers to the province. The resources available for NL Genealogy will be described. A case study will be presented and a question and discussion period available. Information handouts will be provided.

<u>Craving Change/Mindfulness</u> – Dietitian, Susan Rideout will discuss our eating behaviours and why it's hard to change our habits. She will identify what triggers eating and how to overcome obstacles.

<u>Occupational Therapy</u> - An interactive session that will show you how to keep active and improve your balance with easy and safe exercises. Handouts provided.

<u>Take Charge NL</u>- This presentation discusses energy efficient awareness and rebate programs that will help us all use energy wisely, reduce consumption, and save money.

<u>Quilt Trunk Show</u> – Phyllis Fitzgerald is an enthusiastic and avid quilter who will bring samples of her work to show and discuss. Phyllis brings inspiration to anyone who likes to quilt with her vibrant use of colour and her outside-the-box ideas.

<u>Line Dancing</u> – Line Dancing is a choreographed dance with a repeated sequence of steps in which a group of people dance in one or more lines or circles. Everyone executes the steps at the same time.

<u>Gentle Yoga</u> – Participants will take part in a yoga session in some cases using a chair for many of the poses.

<u>Quilt Preservation</u> – The conservation and preservation of quilted items, both antique and contemporary will be discussed. Topics covered will include cleaning, storage, sun damage, stress on fibres, sizing, detergents to use, etc.
